Real Reading Tutoring

Trained tutors work one-to-one with students in grades 2 to 7 on improving reading, comprehension, spelling and writing skills for struggling learners. Our tutors work under the supervision of an experienced, certified teacher.

- October 3 to December 15
- Mon/Weds (19 sessions) OR Tues/Thurs (22 sessions) between 4 and 8 pm
- Held at Janice Churchill Elementary School, 8226-146 street, Surrey
- \$23 per one hour session

Multisensory Math Tutoring

Trained tutors work one-to-one using hands-on activities to build basic math concepts or provide homework support in underachieving students in grades 2 to 12. Our tutor is trained in both the *Math with Manipulatives* and *Montessori Math* approaches.

- Tues/Thurs between 3:30 and 7:30 pm

- \$23 per one hour session

One to One Keyboarding Instruction

This program is designed to teach students aged 8 and up how to touch type using the computer keyboard. The Typewriter™ method uses multisensory instruction which has proven to be effective in both teaching touch-typing skills and in motivating students to practice.

- 45 minute sessions once/week (call for times)
- \$265 for 8 sessions

Kurzweil Software Training for Students

Kurzweil 3000™ is the comprehensive reading, writing and learning software solution for any struggling reader, including individuals with learning difficulties, such as dyslexia, Attention Deficit Disorder or ESL learners. This software is widely available in the Surrey School District. This training will enable students to become proficient and then access it at their school.
