Workshop & Tour Package

Surrey Art Gallery offers studio workshops and exhibition tours for Kindergarten through grade 12. Workshops are taught by skilled art educators. Activities are process-oriented, encourage students to experiment with art media, and explore relevant themes and issues. Tours are developed by experienced Docents (trained volunteer educators) together with Gallery Education staff, and are designed to enhance students' visual literacy and critical thinking skills as they respond to original works of art. Programs are adapted to grade level and incorporate BC Visual Arts Curriculum Prescribed Learning Outcomes.

A tour precedes each morning workshop.

Grades K-2 workshops: 75 minutes

Grades 3-12 workshops: 90 minutes

After an inquiry-based tour of the current exhibitions, students create art in a workshop that explores ideas, subject matter, and techniques they discovered during their tour. 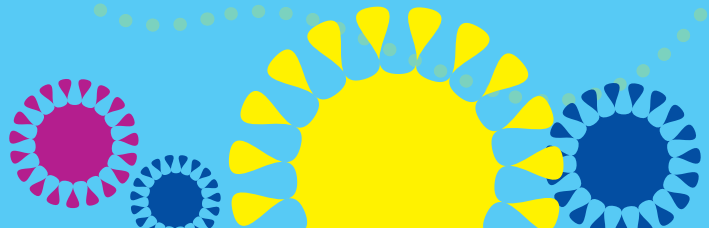
HANDS-ON CLAY

VISION MACHINE

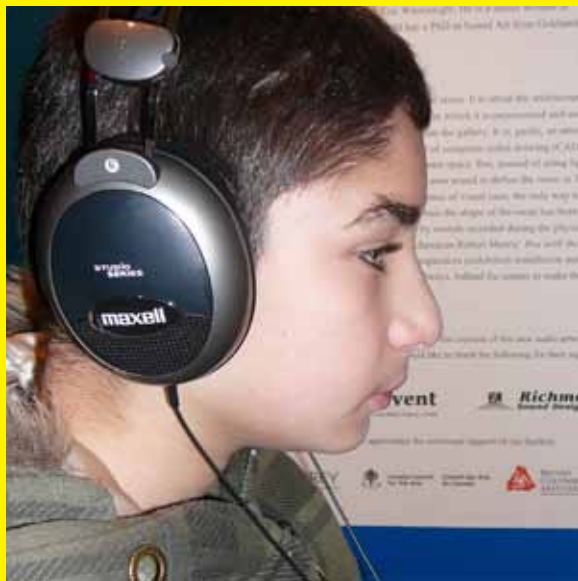
April 6 – June 3, 2012

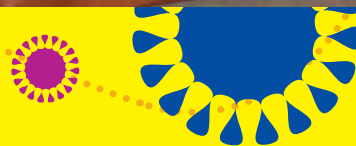
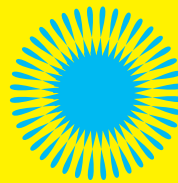
