Fraser Valley Secondary Schools' Athletic Association Scholarship (\$500 value)

Candidates must

- have participated in one of the sports recognized by the F.V.S.S.A.A. or who have provided support to one of these sports programs through Coaching or in a support role and have shown strong Community service
- plan to pursue a sport science through a post secondary institution,
- have the ability to serve, work with, and lead others
- be qualified to enter the first year of a program leading to a Bachelor's degree in the area of physical education or sports science;
- rank academically in the top quarter of students in his/her graduating class.
- have the character and personal qualities including a positive attitude as a student / athlete.
