



## Winter 2011 programs for struggling learners ages 7 to 14

### Real Reading Tutoring one to one

Trained tutors work one-to-one with students in grades 2 to 7 on improving reading, comprehension, spelling and writing skills for struggling learners. Our tutors work under the supervision of an experienced, certified teacher.

- February 7 to May 26, 2011
- Mon/Weds OR Tues/Thurs between 4 and 8 pm

- \$22 per hour (one hour sessions)

### Keyboarding Instruction one to one

This program is designed to teach students aged 8 and up how to touch type using the computer keyboard. The Typeright™ method uses multisensory instruction which has proven to be effective in both teaching touch-typing skills and in motivating students to practice.

- 8 sessions once/week (45 min.)  
weeknight or Saturday programs available
- \$300 for 8 sessions

### Steps to Success Self-Advocacy Training for Youth

For students in grades 6 to 10 with Learning Disabilities and/or Attention Deficit Disorder. This program teaches self-advocacy skills essential to success at school and in life. Students will learn to understand their learning differences and how to speak out and communicate their needs to teachers.

- Sessions starting in April (after spring break)
- 8 once/week sessions (1-1/2 hours)

### Kurzweil Software Training for Students

Kurzweil 3000™ is the comprehensive reading, writing and learning software solution for any struggling reader, including individuals with learning difficulties, such as dyslexia, Attention Deficit Disorder or ESL learners. This software is widely available in the Surrey School District. This training will enable students to become proficient and then access it at their school.

- Saturdays, January 22 to February 26, 2011
- 6 sessions once/week (1-1/2 hours)
- \$150 for 6 sessions
